

Literacy

During Term 4 students will explore poetry texts. Teaching and learning activities will provide students with an understanding of the structure and important features of poetry. We will also be exploring the features and structures of persuasive texts this term. Students will create a range of multimodal texts such as persuasive arguments and posters to extend their knowledge of writing in this genre.

Students will continue to engage in guided reading, spelling activities and speaking and listening tasks.

Maths

During Term 4 students will explore the concept of number through place value and mental computation strategies. Students will explore the connections between multiplication and division.

Students will learn to order and compare a range of objects based upon length, area, volume and capacity. They will apply these skills to solve realistic mathematical problems.

Health & PE
