Permission Notes

Returning permission notes:

- Notes for excursions, incursions, camps and school events must be returned prior to, or on the date, stated on the form.
- This allows time for the final preparations to be made. For example, transport, staffing, hiring of the venue, sports ground and fees.
- Excursions, incursions and events requiring a signed permission note will be cancelled if notes are not returned on time.

All excursions, under the Education Directorates Excursion Policy is a school related activity by students, under the supervision of a teacher/s, directly related to the curriculum of the school. An excursion is a variation to normal activity and is not predominantly recreational.

Professional Learning for Teachers

All teaching staff have engaged in accredited professional learning sessions that will enhance their repertoire of tools to teach successful strategies in reading. Cooperative Reading was developed from research conducted by Glenda Raison and enables students to set and reach their personal reading goals. This program promotes a cooperative learning community and the reading practices will explicitly taught and all students across our school.

Positive Behaviours for Learning

Positive Behaviours for Learning (PBL) is an evidence-based, whole school approach to improve learning outcomes for all students and we are excited about the progress we are making in this space. Implementation of the program is clearly sequenced to ensure a successful rollout. We hosted community BBQs on both the Junior and Senior Campuses

and the parent consultation on our behaviour matrix was well attended. Thank you to all parents who were able to attend the community consultation it was a huge success. We appreciate and value your feedback and look forward to sharing your ideas with the staff and students. Red Unit News



Our history unit is coming to an end with a fun filled excursion to the National Museum. We explored old artefacts and discussed how life has changed over time.







Wanniassa 'Skoolbag' App

PLEASE NOTE: Skoolbag App has done an update users will now need to have a user name and password. Please update your app to ensure you are receiving notes and information. Thank you.



It is available for download now on Android, iOS and Windows phones. To download you can either search Wanniassa through the Play or App stores (or by downloading the Skoolbag app and searching – on Windows devices).

We will be using this app as a primary contact tool with our families so we strongly encourage all our families to install the app on their phones. It's

completely free and there's no limit to the number of devices each family can have the app on.

You can use the app to send us updates to your child's enrolment details, notify us of absences, download permission notes and keep up to date with the events that we have happening around our school.

When you first download and install the app we suggest that you set up your push notification group settings. You can choose which kind of notifications you would like (e.g. Senior Campus, Junior Campus, whole school etc.).

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Senior Campus News

Year 7/8 News

Year 7 have hit the ground running in Term 2 and we have a number of events to look forward to over the coming weeks. Firstly, we would like to congratulate Year 7 on participating in NAPLAN this week. All of our students used NAPLAN as an opportunity to demonstrate the knowledge and skills they have acquired and we look forward to continuing our regular learning and assessment program throughout the remainder of the year.

MAPS lessons have seen Year 7 students sent back in time to Ancient Egypt to discover how hieroglyphics and other cultural artefacts helped to create a communication system. Year 7 STEM has students exploring the practical application of negative numbers in addition to investigating elements, such as the orbit of the Earth, lunar events and the equinoxes, in our Solar System.

In Health, we have been discovering how a person's diet can be influenced through advertising and food packaging and the various nutritional needs of people and how that affects their diet choices. In practical lessons, students continue to duck and weave as we refine our Touch Football skills.

Year 8 have seen a very busy start to the term with a number of projects and investigations already underway. During MAPS lesson, students have been working on writing structure and the importance of persuasive language devices to create essays on Medieval Europe and Shogun Japan. Students will also combine their work in HASS to create a poster and presentation about their time machine and why you should join them on a 5-day trip back to Shogun Japan.

In STEM, Year 8 are using their knowledge of perimeter, area and volume as well as their critical thinking skills to find practical solutions to real-life problems. In Science lessons, students are using a poster to demonstrate their understanding of the particle model and the properties of solids, liquids and gases.

Year 8 Health have been investigating how resilience can develop and effect our ability to form and maintain relationships. We continue to see how important our self-esteem and self-confidence are when developing resilience.


