We would like to congratulate Year 8 students for the way in which they enthusiastically apply themselves to personalising learning. We were able to celebrate the end of Semester One with some outstanding Exhibition presentations where students proudly presented their learning.

We would like to talk with you more about the learning that is happening in Year 8 and provide opportunities for you to meet with your child's teachers. We invite you to a Parent Meeting on Wednesday 17th August at 5.00pm, beginning with the Principal's address followed by a meeting in the Year 8 area. During this meeting, we would like to chat with you about the Personalised Learning model, the requirement for students to bring their Personal Electronic Devices to school, and have individual conversations with you about your child and their learning.

All Year 8 students engage in explicit Maths, Science and History lessons within our MAP times. We will be welcoming two new teachers into our team this term, a mathematics/science and an English/SOSE specialist. Until then, students will attend mathematics/science classes with:
