'Success and excellence in education'

Literacy

Reading – Students will engage in a range of reading programs such as Cooperative Reading and Book Clubs. They will spend time looking through the authors lens as to what makes a good story. The students will also be exposed to scientific texts.

Writing - Students will have daily opportunities to consolidate and further develop their understanding of spelling strategies, grammatical knowledge and proofreading skills in order to become more effective writers. The children will be learning to give and receive constructive feedback as a way to enhance their writing.

Speaking and Listening - These skills will be explicitly taught and modelled throughout the term. Students will be encouraged to share their opinions in class discussions, circle times and during leadership opportunities.

Numeracy

There will be a focus in term four on consolidation of Mathematical strands taught throughout the year and an introduction to algebra. The children will navigate the online program 'Mathspace'. They will continue to work on their recall of number facts through Middle Years Mental Computation strategies and the Maths Mastery Program.

P.E. & Health

During sports leadership students will be participating in a variety of team sports focusing on further developing their fundamental motor skills. During classes students will also be given opportunities to develop their leadership skills whilst promoting fair play and inclusion.

Science

This term will focus on how energy is transferred and transformed in electrical circuits and how it can be generated from a range of sources. The students will plan and conduct experiments noting and discussing the outcomes.

The Arts

The students will have the opportunity to explore dance and drama as well as several visual arts techniques.

HASS

The students will investigate Australia's democracy and citizenship with an emphasis on the status and rights Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders as well as migrants, women and children.

LOTE

In term 3, students will continue to work on reading and writing in Japanese. We will continue our unit on shopping, but moving the focus to buying items from a shop.

Food and Design Technology

Food Technology Year 6

Investigate how to eat healthy and why food is prepared using different methods. Students will design, record, prepare, cook, present and evaluate menus with consideration to being sustainable.

Music

The Year 6 Music curriculum will further their understanding of rhythm, pitch, dynamics and expression, form and structure, timbre and texture in music. It will also extend their understanding and use of aural skills as they sing and play independent parts against contrasting parts and recognise instrumental, vocal and digitally generated sounds.
